The NSGA's connection to Canada traces back to our late founder, Burris Devanney, who was from Nova Scotia.

This enduring relationship has led to the involvement of over 500 Canadians with the NSGA, including teachers, doctors, nurses, health educators, development workers, interns, and other skilled professionals.

Now NSGA is fully owned and operated by Gambians. In 2020, we closed our remaining operations in Nova Scotia, transitioning full ownership and management to our HQ in The Gambia.

Through our Peer Health Education program, Nova Scotia Gambia Association's ultimate goal is to empower African children and youth with education so they can teach their friends, loved ones, and communities how to live healthier, more prosperous lives.



What we do

Peer health education passes important life lessons from classmate to classmate, child to parent, and neighbour to neighbour.

Over 150 schools work with NSGA to enable peer health education in their classrooms and schoolyards.

Together with The Gambia's Ministry of Basic and Secondary Education, the NSGA has been successfully implementing peer health education models in schools across the country.



Our Peer Health Education model

Each school identifies 30 students as official peer health educators (PHEs).



Two teachers are selected to support and guide PHEs.



Teachers and PHEs receive regular training from NSGA staff on various components of health and wellbeing.



PHEs become ambassadors for health in their communities.
